### Recipe from nutrition class

Berry Cornmeal Energy Bites Recipe

Ingredients (makes 12-15 small bites):

- 1 cup finely ground cornmeal (toasted if possible)
- 1/2 cup dried berries (cranberries, blueberries, or raisins)
- 1/4 cup nut butter (sunflower seed butter for nut-free option)
- 1/4 cup honey or maple syrup
- 1/4 tsp cinnamon (optional)
- 1-2 tbsp water (as needed for texture)

### Instructions

In a large bowl, mix cornmeal, dried berries, and cinnamon. Add nut butter and honey/maple syrup. Stir until the mixture holds together. Add a little water if too dry. Roll into small balls using clean hands or a spoon. Place on a tray or plate and enjoy immediately or chill to firm up.
