WINGS OF WELCOME

Please join us in welcoming Ms. Nancy Jackson.

Ms. Jackson is teaching Visual Arts and 2nd/3rd graders. She brings with her a diverse background and numerous skills. She grew up on her family's farm in Ohio. The farm has a grain elevator, where they dry, store, and sell the rest of the family's grain and some of their neighbors. The farm was once home to the indigenous Shawnee people, where to this day they still occasionally find arrowheads in the fields. She completed 9 years in 4 H taking cooking and market barrow projects.

As an adult, she began her career as a graphic designer, working for a specialty advertising company before pursuing art education. For most of her career, she has specialized in the Visual Arts teaching K-12 in the public sector, as well as stateside and overseas for the Department of Defense Education Activity, supporting military students and their families.

Ms. Jackson's approach is unique, as she uses the visual arts as a delivery vehicle for integrating a variety of content, not just art. This helps her students build bridges between their prior knowledge and new content. She feels "enabling" her students helps them to develop confidence and independence in their own learning process. The primary goal of which is to assist them in becoming life-long problem solvers regardless of where their interests take them.

When she is not teaching, she enjoys working with the shaman and healers of the Amazon, of Colombia, who are of the Inca lineage and tradition. She continues to learn about plants that are used for food and medicines. It is here that she learned their beading practice of weaving bracelets. She also creates other ceremonial jewelry, altar cloths, and ceremonial tools.

Ms. Jackson feels deeply honored to be invited to be a part of the Havasupai community. She is looking forward to learning from the students, their families, community members and elders, regarding the Havasupai culture and its indigenous traditions. Ms. Jackson's door is always open, and she welcomes the community to visit her classroom or art room anytime to observe or join in the activity.
